

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"Reminiscing"

Minnesota started requiring all drivers to have driver licenses in about 1938. At that time I was seventeen years old. There was no driver test required; all you needed was the seventy five cent fee.

I started to think about some of the cars I've owned and driven in the years gone by. Our family car that I first drove was a 1927 Paige. This was a four door sedan which was up in the better class of the cars of that period. It was one of the few that had hydraulic brakes. This is the car I learned to drive in. After that the family cars were a 1931 Chrysler Royal with side mounts and trunk rack then there was a 1937 four door Plymouth. My first car was a 1931 Chevrolet five passenger coupe. Later a 1934 Plymouth two door was my next car. This was one of the first with a coil spring front end. Because the Plymouth was such a poor winter starter a 1939 two door Ford Deluxe was my next car. Other cars include a 1930 Ford Model A, a 1935 Ford four door, a 1940 Pontiac Deluxe two door, 1941 Chevrolet two door, 1948 Chevrolet coupe, 1949 Ford two door, 1953 Dodge V8 four door and a 1955 Chevrolet four door V8. I bought our first Corvair, a 1960 four door 700 series. Since I have learned to drive I have had over 30 cars licensed in my name and quite a lot of Corvairs that have passed through my hands. When I retired, I thought I would restore a Corvair, which was a 1963 Corvair Spyder. After driving it for thirteen years I found the 1968 Monza which I now drive.

At age 85 I still get a lot of enjoyment out of playing with my Corvairs.
