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"Ed Says"

#### Size does matter, in Tires

Corvairs 1960-65 used 6:50 X 13 tires as original equipment. The exception was the 1961-62 station wagon which used 7:00 X 13. Later model Corvairs used the 7:00 X 13 size as original equipment. The diameter of the 6:50 X 13 was in the 23 1/2 " Range, and the 7:00 X 13 was in the 24 1/2" range. This will vary slightly for different manufacturers. Radial tires have been in general use for more than 30 years and have improved the handling and ride of the Corvair considerably. The early model used a 4-Bolt—13 X 5 1/2 rim with a 1 3/16" offset. The late models used the 5 bolt wheel with the same specifications. When buying new tires keep as close to the original tire diameter and possible for best results. This will help keep the speedometer accurate eliminate any clearance problems. Replacement tires for the 6:50 X 13 would be 175-80X13 with stock wheels and 185-80X13 for the 7:00 X 13 inch tire. When using different wheels tire offset and diameter must be taken into consideration. There is plenty of literature on this subject available. Also don't forget the pressure differential between the front and rear tires. The front which carry's less weight should be 10-12 pounds lower than the rear tires. 30 in the rear and 18 in the front seems to work iust fine.

## *My Story* By Ed' Lampi's 1964 Corvair Monza Coupe # 40927W185840

I Came together at the Willow Run Corvair assembly plant in the late fall of 1964. I was transported north to Grand Marais, Minnesota, to be sold by the Chevrolet Dealer in that town. I am a little fuzzy about this, But my first owner was a young woman who lived in the area. She became a nurse, and eventually worked in Duluth at St Likes Hospital. I spent several years with her transporting her to work and then back home to Grand Marais on the week ends. This went on for some time and we got along just fine. Eventually, she decided to head west on a vacation trip to the North Dakota area. This was the year 1973. and I had over 60,000 on my odometer . Unfortunately, my engine failed and I was to be sold to an auto recycler, and I lost my first owner.

A person from Duluth who had rebuilt several other Corvairs located me and brought me back to Duluth. I thought I would have a new life. He installed a good 1965 engine, and picked up a lot of other parts that would have spruced up my appearance. Another person saw me at his home, and offered him enough money for me that he could not refuse to accept. This was alright, as I thought that he would go through making me a nice drivable Corvair again. I was moved to his home, and he made a few attempts and giving me a new life. He sanded a few spots, sprayed a little undercoat, and then abandoned me. I was parked outside for several years, my tires went flat, my parts were lying loose inside my body. now left to deteriorate

An El Camino pick up had taken his interest and I was now left to deteriorate.

In the fall of 2005, my owners had decided to leave the Duluth area. And had their property up for sale. I was towed to the driveway entrance where people could see me, and some of these people notified a Corvair owner in the neighborhood that I appeared to be for sale. He came to check me out in my forlorn condition and thought I had possibilities. He was asked to make an offer which he did at a very reasonable price, and it was accepted. He wasted no time in getting me to his home and checking me out. Now I know that something will be done to make me whole again. I have had my oil and filter changed, a new battery, and some tires installed. My interior has been salvaged, and I'm starting to feel like I'll be whole again. Thank You ED! He also helped me write this, as I cannot speak or write.



#### Pat Murphy's Part 2



Well today the Corvair Cavalry was on the road to Pat Murphy's for part 2. The plan of the day was to adjust the valves and balance the carbs. We proceeded to adjust the passenger side valves and had one that wouldn't quiet down. I then went to the Drivers side and they we all a little snug so I got them all where they should be. Then back to the passenger side. Once again I went thru them all and still had one that would not quiet down and would not hold adjustment. After deciding we had a bad lifter it was time to pull it out. The only problem was that we didn't have a spare lifter or a magnet to get it out. SO you guessed it, another trip is the plan. Maybe this time we will be able to finish up this job so it can get on the road again.





We are Proud to announce that at our next monthly meeting we will have a special tech session. Art "The Tool Man" Bringe will be doing a tech session on what tools to bring while traveling in your Corvair. Art has over the years learned to find multi uses for each tool which helps to make a smaller lighter tool box. On a recent trip with Ed Lampi he was able to demonstrate to Ed how an open end adjustable "crescent wrench", can also be used as a jack wrench and also as a lug wrench. Another trick that Art uses is to limit the air in your spare tire to 10 pounds. With the price of gas you don't need that extra weight of air in the spare tire. Another heavy weight item is a Socket set, however if you eliminate the ratchet from the set, it weighs a lot less. It's tricks like these that our elder members can teach the Younger Corvair owners and help us to have safer and more interesting road trips.

Part 2 of this tech session Art will demonstrate his **Self Taught** method of memory control. This is another thing that Art has developed over the years. On a recent Cavalry trip to Hayward, Art was able to store every turn of the road in his mind and this saved precious Glove Box space because there was no need for a map. After the trip Both Ed and I were without words.

### Pat Murphy's Finale

Well The Calvary was on the road again today. Ed and Myself went up to Pat Murphy's to finish up his job. I started in by getting the old lifter out after bit of persuasion and installed the new one. I then re-assembled everything and it was time to start it up and start adjusting. After a little time we had it running nice and smooth. What started out as a tune up ended up as a broken Rocker stud and collapsed lifter. Ed and I were talking on the way home about how happy both of us are in how good the Cavalry idea is working out.
