Work marches on. Just a few rain showers, but the sky is getting awfully dark. They've installed new fan bearing and new idler pulley bearing. Keith was working on assembling the signal switch/steering wheel, lots of tweaking going on, but no heavy moving yet.

Next thing to do is get the engine in. we had a lot of little weird odds and ends to tend to, as well as changing out those bearings, which was going well until after heating up the pulley, we pounded on it and deformed it. we got it bent back to "good enuff" shape for now...it will have to do.

The top cover gaskets have been changed out. the area in the pics where you see the big gloppy area the bolts were barely finger tight right there. two new gaskets and a good torquing fixed it.

the trickiest part of this whole thing, I think, will be One- Getting the snout lined up correctly without Effing myself, and Two- getting the Celica seats fit in well. I think we can do it. I know we can do it. We've already been crazy enough to stay up 24 hours, get 4 hours of sleep, and work on a car all day...there has to be something said for that, I guess. My back hurts. I think Keith is tired too. Both of us are sort of running on fumes this evening. Momma Ronna is fixing homemade lasagna tonight for the family, so that will be very nice.

That's about it for now. Was that short?

Gas tank goes in, sway bar goes on, shrouds go into place, carbs go back on...and some random doo-dads...and we go. We should get most of that done in a few hours tomorrow, then we're gonna drive it around town...tweak it out...show Keith the town. Shouldn't be too hard. then we roll out early monday morning off to Topeka. I'll update again tomorrow.

Then back to work till they busted a bolt off the solenoid...no spare on hand..but the FLAPS has one..so they ran to town to pick one up. Keith seems to be a bit starstruck by our Northern Minnesota style tractor supply style store that last I heard they fe in there wandering around, and picking up a few bolts few bolts.

Engine is bolted in, clutch/throttle, etc. are hooked up, gas tank is in, carbs are on, alternator/belt is on, front signal lights are mostly back in (they're picking up new socket guts in town too) steering wheel is on and signal switch is installed, i think most electrical is hooked up engine wise. It won't be long now, I suspect. I see the exhaust is sitting on the driveway with new donuts on the flanges, so we're getting close. I haven't taken any more photos 'cause it Just looks like two guys staring at a Corvair motor, mostly.
