

Cleaning Heads with Easy Off Oven Cleaner



I bought a blue can off Easy Off Oven cleaner and sprayed it on this head. First I knocked all the big stuff off then a quick bath in the parts washer. Next I sprayed it down with Easy Off and let it sit for about 15-20 mins. I hosed it off and here is the results with almost no brushing or cleaning at all. The heads shine like new. Next is a little digging at the dirt that's left the spray again and blast it with the pressure washer. Make surer you wear rubber gloves and eye protection.
