UPDATE!!!! Ed's 1964 Corvair Monza Coupe Project



Now that I've had this Corvair for the past month I've been able to check it over more carefully. On the positive side there is a good Minnesota Title. The last time it was licensed was the 1973-74 year to a person in Grand Marais Minnesota. The body is in fairly good shape, no major dents and showing only some minor rust areas. The motor turns over and all major components seem to be in place. AT this time a set of used Radial tires have been mounted and balanced. The master brake cylinder was dry of brake fluid, but the brake linings are still very serviceable. The interior has suffered damage form the sun and will require some refurbishing. Some sanding and priming had been done and then abandoned. It appeared that a new gas tank is in place. Most of the exterior trim is there and in great shape. Most of my time has been occupied in clean up of all areas. The motor, interior, and trunk have all been vacuumed and some rust-proofing sprayed. All areas have been checked to see what has to be done to make this abandoned vehicle into a reliable driver. The oil has been changed and a new filter installed. A distributor with the gear removed and attached to an electric drill was used to pump oil to all bearing



surfaces. A new battery was installed to turn the engine over to further distribute the oil. A compression test revealed That most valves are not operating properly, which will be addressed by removing the valve covers and freeing the valve stems in some manner. A distributor has been checked out, a new plug wire set is ready for install, as well as a serviceable fuel pump. I am now taking parts to my basement for refurbishing and will leave the mechanical service for better weather conditions. It seems that this is a pretty much "Bare Bones" Monza. It appears that of all the upgrades that were available, a push button AM Radio was the only option. According to the motor number, some one installed a 1965 110 HP motor in the car. It has a manual 3 speed transmission. No padded dash, a regular rear view mirror, not a day-night, and a non-stock outside mirror. A set of NOS wheel covers are on the car along with a complete set of used covers. I feel that all in all, this car was a real bargain, and that's difficult to come by in this day and age. Did someone mention CORVAIRITIS? This is proof that it can get it at any age. Ed Lampi

Saturday morning showers did not dampen spirits as nearly a dozen Vairs left the motel parking lot for a scenic tour of rural Boise and a visit to the dam and a huge powerhouse which supplies all its power to Seattle, but none to Boise! After completing a challenging Corvair trivia quiz designed by our tour leader, Greg Reeder, we were off on the last leg of the tour through some scenic hilltop areas and finished at a raptor sanctuary high above the city. It was a very interesting and enlightening tour enjoyed by all.
